In the Field: Quartz Cleaning

Quartz & Agate Cleaning by Ron Whealdon

Thoroughly scrub specimens with hot, soapy water until you can no longer remove any material and stains. Then rinse in clean water and dry.

Oxalic Acid Bath: This process can be used to remove rust-staining from your specimens.

Supplies:

Old crock pot (can find at garage sales or the Goodwill store)

Oxalic acid 1-gallon jug (clean)

1 gallon hot water

Funnel

Slotted plastic long-handled spoon

Chemical-resistant gloves Safety glasses or goggles

Baking soda 5-gallon bucket of clean water

This process should be done outdoors and while wearing the safety gear (gloves and glasses). **DO NOT do this indoors!** Measure out 4 oz. of oxalic acid onto a piece of paper, and using a funnel, carefully pour into the 1-gal, jug that's been filled half-way with hot water. Using the same funnel, slowly pour in the remaining hot water (careful not to allow the jug to overflow).

Replace the cap tightly and then gently rock the jug back and forth to mix thoroughly. Feel free to hum a soft lullaby if you're inclined to do so. Carefully pour acid from the bottle into the crock pot, filling it no more than 2/3 full. One at a time, place a specimen in the slotted spoon and carefully lower into the crock pot. DO NOT allow specimens to just plop into the crock pot! Allow the specimens to bathe at low setting for about 12 hours. Turn the crock pot off and unplug. Let the specimens continue to soak in the crock pot for another 12 hours.


After the 24-hour bath, use the slotted spoon to carefully transfer the specimens from the crock pot to a bucket of clean water. Soak the specimens in clean water for 72 hours (changing the water at least once every 24 hours). Thoroughly scrub specimens with hot, soapy water until you can remove no more of the mate-rial or staining. If a specimen still exhibits staining, you can re-peat this process as necessary. I'd think that after a week of cooking and soaking in oxalic acid though, either the stains are there for good, or they require a more drastic approach.

Disposing of Oxalic Acid:

When oxalic acid yellows, it has outlived its usefulness and it is time to dispose of it, safely. Again, this process should be

done outdoors while wearing gloves and glasses. Carefully pour the contents of the crock pot into a bucket of clean water. Carefully pour in baking soda, a little at a time, stopping in between pours to allow the fizzing to stop. Once you reach the point when fizzing no longer occurs, then the acid has been neutralized enough for disposal. Carefully pour the contents of the bucket onto the driveway and rinse very well with the hose.

An update on Walt Lombardo and a request for your Support

On January 29, 2016, Walt received a life-saving Kidney Transplant from Scripps Green Hospital in La Jolla. The surgery was successful and the kidney is performing very well. Unfortunately, there were complications, while not totally unexpected, it did delay his recovery. The doctors continue to refine his medications. He was finally discharged in early February, although he had to stay locally for daily checks. Walt continues to improve but his activities are limited. He will not be cleared by his doctors to return to work for at least another 6 to 8 weeks. And he still is required to return to Scripps for blood tests and meeting with his doctors twice a week for the next six months. Eight years ago when he went into renal failure (and started dialysis), Walt opened Nevada Mineral & Book Company (natural history gallery/bookstore) in Orange, CA. During these eight years of waiting for a kidney, he had numerous health issues due to complications of the renal failure and surgeries... Medicare only pays a portion his medical and drug costs, including some very expensive top-tier drugs (that have no generic alternatives), so his medical costs have been & continue to be very high! Walt has always been very generous with his time; sharing his expertise; and working with the community. Walt is a proud and independent man and does not like to ask for help! Walt's medical, as well as personal & business, bills are piling up with virtually no income. Walt does not qualify for Medicaid or Social Security Disability because he owns a business. And at 60 he is too young to collect a pension or apply for Social Security.

The *good news* is that he has had some help from the 501(c)(3) Non-Profit Organization "MINDS Network" (http://www.mindsnetwork.org/). MINDS Network's president, Dr. Taif Kaissi, is personally overseeing Walt's cause! But they can only help so much.
