Fakes, Frauds and Fantasies

Investigate. Detect clues. Observe. Puzzle out the truth. Learn the forensics to be a Mineralogy SCI.

We are not able to collect every stone in our collections personally. When we do purchase, we need to make educated decisions. Getting fooled or spending too much purchasing gems & minerals is a crime. Learn some of the common misnamed gems & minerals. Learn common "enhancements" that should always be disclosed, and learn to identify possible deception. Some misnomers are innocent errors handed down through history, handy nicknames or tools of tricksters. Let's sort out the facts together.

A-ROCKS AND MICROMOUNTS

There's a Yahoo Group that's been active since 1999. LA-ROCKS is not just a clothing site, it's a group of rockhounds generally based around Los Angeles who enjoy talking about rocks and going out on field trips and local shows. Discussions



involve gems and minerals, collecting sites, rock and gem shows and coordination of field trips in southern California. The group is non-affiliated to any club or other group, posting items from all over SoCal. At the site you can sign up to receive the new notices sent to your mailbox so you don't have to remember to visit. You can find their group at https://beta.groups.yahoo.com/neo/groups/LA-Rocks/info.

Margaret saw a post recently announcing a talk about the McDermitt Mercury Mine in northern Nevada, a site we visited several years ago as part of a Searchers Extended trip. The talk was hosted by a Micromount arm of the Mineral Society of Southern California (MSCC) and it was the first time we were exposed to that side of rock-hounding.

Micromounts are very small specimens of geologic material that can only be appreciated under magnification. They are mounted in small open boxes about 1" square and are the exact opposite of a yard rock! These little gems (sic) must be seen under a stereo microscope at 10-40x power. As you can see from the picture, the room was filled with these microscopes. The 'hound holds the specimen under the microscope and moves it around to see all the colors and structure of the mineral. Some scopes have camera attachments or special lighting in different wavelengths. It's very cool and geeky.

These collectors are more aligned with the geology and "serious" side of rock-appreciation, but they were generous with their time and knowledge while Margaret and I were there. They have field trips around the area, but it's not about finding rocks for making slabs and jewelry, it's about understanding the geology and formation of minerals and finding specimens of material that show off its formation and beauty under magnification. It's a subset of this wonderful science/hobby/career/calling and they had no problem calling themselves Rockhounds. If you ever get a chance to attend or see what they do, take it. You won't be disappointed.
